

EUACA STRATEGY

MISSION	To deliver a professional, neutral, transparent, non-discriminatory service to the aviation industry in order to contribute to efficient solutions to optimising the use of capacity at European Airports
STRATEGY	The EUACA will (in no order of priority):
Expansion	Proactively seek opportunities to expand the EUACA by increasing membership and associate membership amongst the EU and EEA Member States
Communication	Provide a forum for members and associate members to be kept up to date on all matters relating to coordination and facilitation, to exchange information amongst each other, and to decide on common positions and actions.
Support	Endeavour to support and assist coordinators and schedules facilitators when required and provide opportunities for training newcomers to the coordination industry.
Influence	Proactively work with regulators and industry bodies, both in the EU and worldwide, to influence the development of rules and regulations appropriate to the needs of the coordination industry including the development of any market based solutions in the EU.
Standards	Where appropriate develop and agree common interpretations of the Regulation and encourage all members to act in conformity with these standards. To advise members and associate members on industry best practices.
Research	Undertake projects and research to improve the standards of coordination and schedules facilitation in the EU
Funding	Continuously develop the EUACA funding model to ensure adequate funding for the operation of an effective organisation supported by a professional secretariat.
	Ensure a fair and equitable apportionment of the EUACA's costs between its large and small members and associate members.
Systems	Continuously develop the EUACA's database and web site. Develop systems and processes to meet the needs of the organisation. Work proactively with systems suppliers to develop a range of systems products for coordinators and facilitators.
Commercial	Consider and evaluate all appropriate and profitable opportunities to generate revenue from the EUACA's activities by exploiting the assets and expertise of the organisation and its members
Co-operation	Establish and maintain continuous dialogue and relationships with appropriate industry bodies to develop common ground on key issues affecting coordination. Work with these organisations to develop common understanding on key issues through a process of co-operation, collaboration and joint activities.
WWACG and WASB	Together with non-EU coordinators formally establish the WWACG as the worldwide organisation representing the views of coordinators and schedules facilitators. Influence and cooperate with regulatory and industry bodies worldwide through the WWACG and the Worldwide Airport Slot Board (WASB) which WWACG is a part of.
Process Change	Implement appropriate and agreed process changes resulting from the IATA scheduling process review quickly and efficiently at all airports for which EUACA members are responsible.
